SIGN OF THE CROSS

It is a profession of Faith in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. It is public and private profession, It is both personal and communal.

It is a symbol of the Mystery of the Trinity that one accepts in faith.

It is a blessing that one invokes upon oneself or anyone that one signs with this sign.

It is acknowledgment of the loving presence of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit who are with us in all ways and in all things.

It is acknowledgment of the death of Christ on the cross as a means of salvation of self and others.

It is a sign of one asking to be placed under the protection of the blessing on the Holy Trinity.

It is a sign of our commitment to Christ.

It is a sign of our commitment to the Roman Catholic Church.

It is a sign of asking a blessing upon our head (mind), our heart (spirit) and our body.

It is an acknowledgment of our desire to live in a loving relationship with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

It is a sign of our intention to enter into prayer or any endeavor in accordance with the will of the Father.

It is a recognition that one is reborn into a new life and a desire to be transformed into a new creation.

It is a sign that one must identify with Christ on the cross so that one may rise with him.

It is an acknowledgment of one's decision to pick up one's cross and follow Jesus.

It is a way of invoking the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit so that one will be open to the gift of grace from them.

It is a sign of one's desire to bless others such as our children or when we hear or observe an accident or when visiting the sick.

It is a sign by which we may recognize Christ's presence in the tabernacle as we pass by the church.

It is an acknowledgment of God as Father, Jesus as the Son and our Brother and of the Holy Spirit as our guide and counselor.

It is a recognition of one's dependence upon God in all one does and says.

It is a sign on one's desire to be protected from sin, temptation and fear.

In making the sign of the Cross we must understand what we are doing and we must make the sign with due care and reverence. We do this not only as a sign of our faith to self, but also as a witness to others of our faith and to our world. It is a sign by which we can give glory to God.
