### EXPLANATION OF EPIPHANY:

The Feast of Epiphany is the completion of Christmas and the pinnacle of Christmastide. It is the fulfillment of the desires expressed during Advent. "Come Lord Jesus, come!" On Epiphany, Jesus does indeed manifest Himself to all men - not only Jew, but Gentile as well. "He is come!"

"People are instructed in the truths of faith and come to appreciate the inner joys of Christianity far more effectually by the annual celebration of Sacred Mysteries than by any official pronouncement of the teaching of the Church. Such pronouncements usually reach only a few and the more learned among the faithful. Feasts reach them all. The Church's teaching affects the mind primarily: her feasts affect both mind and heart, and have a salutary effect upon the whole man's nature." (Pius XI, Quas Primas)

Christmas is the intimate family feast of the Catholic Church. Epiphany is the world feast of the Catholic Church. At Christmas, God appears as man. At Epiphany, this man—Christ—appears to the world as God.
