COMMUNION

Part of the Sacrifice is the consuming of the victim. Therefore, the reception of Holy Communion (consuming of the victim) is part of the Sacrifice. Though the Church commands the faithful to receive Holy Communion only once a year during the Easter season, she urges us to receive frequently, even daily.

Therefore, to make the act of worship perfect on our part, we should, after the Priest has consumed the victim, go to the table *(Altar rail)* and ourselves receive the Sacred Body and Blood of Our Lord, the victim of Sacrifice.

The Best Manner of Worshipping God

The best manner of assisting at Mass—is to offer it to God with the Priest for a particular intention, to meditate on Christ's sufferings and death, and to receive Holy Communion. Use the Missal; read it with the priest; say the very prayers he is saying. That is the intelligent manner of assisting at Mass; that is really praying the Mass. A. M. D. G.
