## ch. II - An Exposition of the Wise Man's Words

This week we celebrate the feasts of St. Paul the Hermit and St. Anthony of Egypt. These glories of the early Church fled to the solitude of the desert to more perfectly serve God in heroic fasting and penance. While we may not be called by the Spirit to live such an austere life, we still must overcome the world, the flesh, and the devil by fleeing to the desert at least in spirit. We can accomplish this spiritual flight by following that great yet simple teaching of holy Solomon, "Guard you heart with all vigilance, for all life issues forth from it." Inspired by the Holy Ghost, Solomon admonishes all that they heed these words of his, "for they are life to those who find them." Just as these holy Desert Fathers removed themselves from the evils and distractions of their times to care only for God, we, too, should flee willful occasions of sin and banish even the desire for sinful things. By freeing the heart from such dangerous and vain cares, we enter this spiritual desert. Let us not be afraid of the labors required for this, for God Himself will refresh us with the oasis of His grace and consolation, if only we ask Him sincerely.

God has been pleased to raise up saints who reached such heights of penance and perfection in order to encourage us by seeing the might of His grace and to inspire us to imitate their purity of heart and love of God. The supernatural charity kindled by God will be the life which comes forth from our hearts. On the other hand, if become lax in our watchfulness over our affections, we lay our souls open to the assaults of our spiritual enemies who tirelessly endeavor to bring about our spiritual death by invading our heart. Let us take the Immaculate Heart of Mary to be our model and protector as we practice custody of the heart throughout the year.
